Sibley vs. USA Colonel Edward Canby. The Herman's visited these Civil War areas which are private property closed to the public where they got some seldom seen battle and terrain pictures i.e. Fort Bliss, Fort Craig, Fort Union, and the Battles of Valverde, Santa Fe, and Glorieta Pass. Our speaker, Lynn Herman is the former State Representative in the PA House of Representatives serving the 77th Legislative District largely Philipsburg, Port Matilda, and State College areas of Centre County for 24 years (1983–2006).

He is currently a Government Relations/Business Development Consultant and President of Hometown Sports Magazine. Julianne Herman is retired after 45 years employed as a Registered Nurse in the Operating Room, graduating from St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing. She currently serves as Secretary on the PA Military Museum Board of Directors.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Herman are Civil War reenactors and share an interest and

passion for all American history. They have served the Central PA Civil War Round Table for several years as President and Secretary respectively.

Lynn and Julianne have presented programs to Civil War Round Tables on their Civil War travels. These include Civil War in the Far, Far West, Civil War Florida, Tragedy in Lawrenceville, PA – The Allegheny Arsenal Explosion, and The New Mexico Campaign and the Battle of Glorieta Pass, the Gettysburg of the West which will be presented this Wednesday.

Historian, Point Lookout Prison Camp Scholar and Author of:

If It Were Not For Hope, How Could We Live In A Place Like This?

The Civil War Prison Camp at Point Lookout, MD **July 1863 - August 1865**

Point Lookout Prison Camp in Maryland was a massive Civil War prison (1863-1865) on the Chesapeake Bay constructed in the wake of the Battle of Gettysburg with the need for immediate housing for many of the captured Confederate prisoners. It held a significant role in the prisoner of war system throughout its existence, as well as the aftermath of the Civil War.

Bob Crickenberger has spent over 30 years researching the Point Lookout Prison. He presents a clearer picture of what happened at this prison camp to both guards and prisoners, as well as presents newly uncovered information.

As First Ladies, Mary Todd Lincoln and Varina Banks Howell Davis experienced 19th-century political life at the highest levels. In some ways they were quite similar — southern, well-educated, and gifted conversationalists. They both had their fair share of critics during their husbands' time in office, and neither woman was one to sit back quietly. In addition to handling the duties that came with being the president's wife, they were mothers of young children during a time when disease took a deadly toll on families, hence they were forced to deal with both stress and grief. Each survived her husband and sought to preserve his memory. However, only one of the two women triumphed over her circumstances, the other became a victim.

In this course, you'll learn from Kelly Hancock, director of programs for the American Civil War Museum. As a public historian focused on the American Civil War for almost 25 years, Kelly Hancock researches the lives of individuals and explores how their stories intersect with history. She uses historic writings, documents, objects, and photographs (some of which are in the American Civil War Museum's own collection) to enhance presentations and aid people of today in seeing the past as the past saw itself.
